### **Clinton National Airport is prepared for the winter storm**

*Crews will begin working late and will stay until weather conditions improve*

**LITTLE ROCK, ARK. (January 21, 2016)** – Bill and Hillary Clinton National Airport is ready and on stand-by for winter weather. Crews will be on duty beginning at 10 p.m. tonight, and will start clearing runway and taxiway surfaces and parking lots as soon as winter weather begins. The airport's large fleet of blower trucks, vacuums, broom trucks and ice breakers is in place if needed.

Shifts of airfield employees plan to work the duration of the event to keep the airport operating; however, each airline makes an individual decision as to whether it will fly. Some carriers have already cancelled flights for early tomorrow morning. Please check your airline's website for the latest information before coming to the airport.
